Project Reports:

- Brian and Josh have been restoring a Champ over the past several years. Brian reports that it is complete from firewall aft. Engine mounting and firewall forward work to be finished.
- Robin Kidder reported on her Piper Clipper. The engine overhaul is complete and ready to be mounted. See pictures later in this edition.
- Bob Burkhart's RV9A that was severely damaged by Florida hurricane last year is being restored by Bill Duffy. Bob described how he negotiated with insurance company to use proceeds to purchase salvage.
- Steve Pollack talked about continuing saga installing Dynon static ports for airspeed accuracy. He also cited difficulty installing RV7 wheel pants.
- Roscoe reported on problems insuring a restored Grumman Tiger due to company's reluctance to insure for true value.

Flight Advisor Scott Hersha:

Scott talked about his role as chapter Flight Advisor. His job is to help builders prepare for fist flight and provide guidance through phase 1 flight testing. He does not do flight testing but can advise us if we are the ones to test.

Scott went on further to talk about Task Based Flight testing during phase 1. The idea is to put the 40 hour flight test period to good use by keeping track of data. Task Based flight testing is more detailed than just flying off your 40 hours. He encouraged us to use the EAA Manual and Flight Test Cards. Task Based Flight Testing allows you to develop a real Aircraft Operators Handbook—AOH.



Although I do own a Merlin kit that was a partially built project when I purchased it, and I also own a completed Merlin, I have never actually completed my own build. How I actually came into the Merlin kit is a story for another day, but the end of the story is that the kit chose me, I didn't really choose it.

Well, Quinn's 3rd birthday is quickly approaching in July, so I now have a *"It will fly on Tuesday"* deadline!


I've still got a ways to go, and a short time to get there, but what I've learned in building this little plane is that it is still "A Build" that requires time, dedication and discipline.
