## VMC CLUB WITH BILLY BIE

For this VMC Club Meeting, Billy told us about his attendance at a Eurocontrol Conference that he attended with his wife in Belgium. Billy's wife flies for UPS. He explained that Eurocontrol is the Equivalent to FAA in Europe being Europe's aviation regulatory agency. Billy stated that there were FAA representatives at the conference.:. Topics covered were skill shortages, retention of skilled personnel, rebuilding capacity, Human Error Factors, Startle Factor, and Competency Based Training Assessment (CBTA).



Billy then showed a video story about a tragic incident in the UK that resulted in the death of a pilot and his passenger. A pilot found himself flying from VFR condi-

tions into IMC. He found himself lost over top of an overcast. In the process of asking ATC for assistance, he accepted a clearance to descend into the clouds. He was not instrument rated, and was not prepared to fly in IFR conditions. Upon later examination of the incident, it appeared that the pilot had sufficient fuel to fly to an area where VFR conditions prevailed. He should have asked for vectors to better conditions instead of accepting a clearance to descend into clouds. Also, ATC should have been more assertive and attempted to ascertain this pilot's skill level before directing into IFR conditions.

The hazards from this story:

**Poor Planning** 

Poor ATC help

Poor Decision Making

The lessons here:

Check weather early and often before and during flight Have a good fuel reserve Plan for diversions
