Parallel taxiways will be repaved in two years along with runway light service.

He gave a brief report on his Sun N Fun experience where he placed an order for a Kit Fox kit. He initially hesitated due to a two year wait time. PROGRAM-FLYING TO THE BAHAMAS, TOM MARTIN



Tom Martin gave us an excellent talk about flying to the Bahama Islands. In effect you are essentially leaving the United States and crossing a significant stretch of ocean. Tom said that serious preparation is required starting several months before your anticipated departure. He said his first experience was somewhat overwhelming and anxiety provoking both in preparation and execution. Now, having done this 6 times, it is far less stressful, but he said it still requires advanced preparation and planning. There are several aircraft, passenger, equipment, documentation, and pilot requirements that must be met. It is absolutely essential and required by law to carry flotation devices for all crew and passengers. A radio station license is required as is ADSB out. Tom said that you will find yourself dealing with multiple agencies such as military, air traffic control and customs.

Tom, the knowledge and skill you've developed in flying internationally is something to be proud of. Thank you for sharing your experience with us and thanks for a great program!
