Web Tip of the Month

Young Eagles Functionality

Did you know that the website has the ability to interactively schedule Young Eagles Flight dates, and allow youngsters to sign up online? Well it can, and we'll show you how in this month's WTOM. In case you've missed our previous tips, they're listed below.


Let's start by showing what you see when you select "Young Eagles" from the left-hand navigation bar (**Figure 1**). This loads the page shown in **Figure 2**. As you can see, the inset gray box shows the currently schedule dates, their locations, and how many open slots we have for young eagles. But how is this controlled? I'm glad you asked.

If you've been granted administrator access (by being the Web-Monkey or a Young Eagle's Coordinator), you'll see the options in **Figure 3**, including to 'Update the YE Calendar'. This option takes you to the form shown in **Figure 4**. The form shows the currently scheduled dates, and a form to enter new dates. You simply select the date, how many eagles you plan to fly,

and how many that you have reserved (because, say you plan to fly 20 kids, but a local Cub Scout Troop plans to bring 10, you would enter 20 with 10 filled). Once you click the "Create/Update/Delete YE Date" button, the new date will be shown on the YE page (updated version of **Figure 2**).

Similarly you can edit a previously entered date, changing the number of eagles you can fly, close the date (which will deactivate the ability for kids to enroll online), or delete a date by entering the date and location, and selecting the Delete or Closed checkboxes, as appropriate, and clicking the update button again. Great, eh? But, how do kids sign up? Glad you asked.

Look at **Figure 5**, which now has a very special YE date. Also note two new options have appeared. The first is a registration link; the second is for a permission form. The permission for is the PDF file from National EAA. The registration link brings up **Figure 6**, where the young eagle can enter their contact information, and select from one of the open YE flight dates. Once they submit the form, the number of open slots is reduced by one. Also note that the YE can select "Contact me with a date near me", so we can send kids we know to the website and allow them to pre-register and we can then schedule dates where we have clusters of interested young people. Isn't that AWESOME? YEA! Go Web-Monkey!







