The Prez Says

Ed Schwinn, Chapter President

First of all I want to thank Barry Fear for stepping up to the plate and volunteering to lead the pancake breakfast in August. Now we're relying on our members to help Barry and volunteer to help one of the days or both. This is the only fund raiser we do and we need the support of our membership.

I'm back in Florida again as I write this. The heat is much different than it was in April, my last visit. It redfines "hot". The grandkids are on their way to visit as we speak.

When I was here in April, I took a couple of friends to Sun-N-Fun for their first visit. One of them is a pilot, although he has been inactive for a long time. He was telling me about flying an Aeronca C-3 in his day and loaned me an AOPA Pilot magazine from March 1981 that had an article on the C-3.

This gave me a chance to look at what was in aviation news 28 years ago. Recall, Ronald Reagan was president and we were in the middle of a recession. Sound familiar?

Here's some of the news highlights from that time:

- AOPA attacks user fees proposal "AOPA has urged the Reagan Administration to reject proposals that would lead to higher general aviation user fees and pave the way for a raid on the Airport and Airway Trust Fund by the FAA".
- General aviation has been given the lowest priority for IFR flight approvals in the FAA's controller strike contingency plan "AOPA has asked the FAA to revise the plan for a more equitable distribution of flight services".
- Air traffic controllers are not the only ones considering a strike this month; airline pilots, too may walk of their jobs "The stage for a pilots strike was set by the board of directors of the ALPA, which recently voted to authorize "a series of protest actions", including a nationwide suspension of airline services to occur no later than March 1, 1981".
- The long awaited flight of the Space Shuttle Columbia mahy take place this month "NASA tentatively scheduled the mission for March 17, depending on the test firing of the orbiters

three main engines in early February".

• AOPA has called upon the FAA to withdraw its proposal to return to large registration marks on general aviation aircraft – "The use of smaller N numbers has not created a safety problem that would justify the cost that owners would face in having their aircraft repainted, the association said".

As I read this some of the article, it was hard to believe it was written 28 years ago. The issue also had the general aviation aircraft directory listing the prices on some of commercial aircraft that were still being built. You could but a brand new C-152 for \$21,000, a C-172 Skyhawk for \$33,900, a Piper Super Cub for \$31,400, and a Piper Warrior II for \$32,100. Ahh the good ole days!!!
