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KEN JONES SUCCEEDS WITH BASICMED!

I thought it would be good to interview a few of our chapter pioneers who have applied for the new FAA BasicMed certification. Al Kenkel described his experience in his Prez Sez column. I then had a chance to interview Ken Jones about his experience.

Ken told me he first went to the AOPA website where the application form can be filled out online or printed and filled out by hand. Ken filled his out on the website down to the doctor's checklist. He then took the form to his primary care provider ie his regular MD that he has been seeing for 30 years. Ken related that when he first called for his appointment, there were some concerns about whether his MD would do this. He took the form, which included some frequently asked questions that MD's would be concerned about such as "Am I allowed to do this?" and "How do I determine my patient's fitness to fly?" to the office. The office staff saw it was straight forward, which alleviated their concerns. Ken said that it helped that his primary care doc knew him and his medical history well. He thought it might have been a little more difficult going in cold to someone who didn't know him.

The exam went smoothly with his MD having no difficulty answering the questions on the form. He got a good physical out the experience. Basically, what is required is that you have no physical impairments that would prevent an applicant from holding a valid driver's license. Ken went to his MD on Thursday 4/27. He then went on line again and took the FAA's course on self determination of fitness to fly on line, passed the quiz, and on Monday 5/1, the certification became effective according to law. His course certificate and application are now tucked away with his log book, and he is good to go.

Ken highlighted that much of determination of fitness to fly is knowledge of medications you take and how they affect you. This was a big part of the course and quiz. Overall, he expressed satisfaction with the process. The process was smooth and easy, and he now has the peace of mind knowing that his flying future is secure, especially now that he has his Glassair to look forward to.

Thanks, Ken, for sharing your experience with the chapter !
