

He learned to fly via Bob Ferguson and was building a Sky Ranger. When he joined chapter 974, many members came to know him through his premier welding and metal working skills. Bill was extremely generous in sharing his skill with us and typically refused to be compensated for his work. Most recently he welded a fitting onto my Tiger Moth fuel tank and built a tow bar for Brian Charlton's Waiex. There were many other chapter members who benefitted from his generosity. We all knew he was struggling to breathe, but none of us expected him to turn for the worse so soon. We were not prepared to lose you Bill. There will be a part of you flying in many of our aircraft, and your spirit will live on with us. Many thanks go to Brenda Ferguson and Brian Charlton for helping me write this tribute. 








BILL DOING WHAT HE LOVED & DID BEST
