TOM MARTIN'S HANGAR CROCKPOT SHRIMP JUMBALAYA



Ingredients

• 1 pound mild andouille sausage (Kroeger & Son Meats @ Findlay Market Recommended) cut into thin slices

- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 large green bell pepper, seeded and chopped
- 3 stalks celery, chopped
- 1 (28 oz.) can fire roasted diced tomatoes with juice (Muir Glen Organic @ Kroger Recommended)
- 3 cloves garlic, chopped
- 2 1/2 cups vegetable broth
- 1 tablespoon Tony Chachere's Creole Seasoning (or to taste)
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- 2 pounds extralarge uncooked shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 1 3/4 cups long-grain rice

How to Make It

Step 1 - The Night Before

Combine sausage, onion, green pepper, celery, tomatoes, garlic, chicken broth, creole seasoning, thyme and oregano in a large (5-quart) slow cooker. Cook covered on low until morning (6 hours).

Step 2 - The Next Morning (2 Hours Before Serving)

Stir in rice and continue to cook on low. Stir occasionally, and if consistency becomes too think, add additional vegetable broth and continue to cook covered.

Step 3 - 1 Hour Before Serving

Fold in shrimp. Continue to cook covered for approximately 1 hour, and turn cooker to warm until ready to serve.
