

Steve Pollack is working toward renewal of his Flight Instructor Certificate. He posed an interesting question to us about lift. It is something that sometimes comes up as an exam question and is often discussed. He asked us: "What is always present when a wing is producing lift even when the lift is insufficient for flight?" The answer is vortices. Apparently this was demonstrated in video recording of the effect of airflow over both wings when an airplane is spinning. This was done with yarn tufts cemented to the upper surfaces of both wings and comparing the outer and inner wing.
