Flight Advisor Review

Chapter Flight Advisor Scott Hersha reviewed the Flight Advisor program with us. The goal is to improve safety especially in the first few hours of flight testing a newly build aircraft. Scott said the Flight Advisor does not give flight instruction but gives general advice and will help you determine your readiness to begin testing your new aircraft. For specific advice about unfamiliar aircraft, Scott will guide you and help you find someone familiar with your specific aircraft. Scott emphasized that the final decision to fly is the pilot's only, but after an interview, he might suggest not flying until better prepared. Thanks Scott for your excellent review!

VMC Club Billy Bie

Billy started off by reviewing how we should brief our passengers. A passenger can be useful and even vital for looking for other traffic. It is mandatory that we brief our passengers on how to open the door and evacuate after an emergency landing. He encouraged us to think about expectations during takeoff roll and initial climb out..This should include expected engine performance abort op-

tions and possible emergency landing areas. Billy also addressed issues with inaccurate weather reports especially as they come from inaccurate ASOS systems. Finally, we reviewed hazards with regards to non-towered airports, especially as it relates to radios and local frequencies. Even as we use our radios to announce pattern entry and position, the bottom line is constant visual alertness for awareness of other aircraft. Thank you Billy for an excellent and informative VMC session!
