Howard Pleviak invited us all to his hangar after the gathering for his hangar sale.








KEILAH GILL'S WINGS OF GRACE INTERNSHIP

Keilah, chapter 974 could not be more proud of you and will continue to support your aviation missionary goals.! Photos: ed., Tom Martin












NON-TOWERED FIELD HAZARDS, SCOTT BALMOS

Chapter member Scott Balmos Flew his RV9A to Aiventure Oshkosh as he has for the past several years. On his way this year, he decided to land at Dodge County, KUNU, near Juneau, Wisconsin, for fuel and stretch his legs. He felt this would be a good stop to prepare for the Fisk arrival, especially if there were any delays approaching Oshkosh. Dodge County has two intersecting runways and uncontrolled ie non towered. As Scott Announced his departure, another aircraft decided to use the intersecting runway. Scott very clearly announced his takeoff and departure intentions and began his takeoff. As he reached rotation speed, the other aircraft crossed right in front of him, apparently on his way to the FBO, without a radio call to announce his position or intention. Scott aborted his take off. He felt it was obvious the other pilot was not listening to his radio or paying attention to what was going on around him. The result was an active runway incursion and potential disaster. Scott urged us all to practice good situational awareness and use effective communication. Thank you Scott for sharing your experience with us!
